#### **Final Advice**

"Don't be afraid to ask for help or feedback from the people you trust. They may notice something about you and have ideas that you had never considered before. Have honest conversations and talk about your likes and dislikes."





#### **Final Advice**

"Last, and this is really important, is to not get too stressed out about your future career. You don't have to have it all figured out right now! Even some of our teachers say that they're still deciding what they want to be when they grow up."
